

11th Malaysia Plan (2016-2020)

The Objective

- 1) To assist the government in preparing the 11th Malaysia Plan document.
- 2) To obtain feedback and solicit ideas how best Dayak interest can be incorporated into the 11th Malaysia Plan document.

1. Introduction

This year, 2015 is the last year of the 10th Malaysia Plan (2011-2015). Arising from this, the government, through the Economic Planning Unit (EPU) in the Prime Minister's Department is in the midst of preparing the 11th Malaysia Plan document (2016-2020). In as far as government agencies are concern, EPU will initiate discussion through the Inter Agency Planning Group (IAPG) to gather input, feedback, ideas and suggestions for consideration to be incorporated into the plan.

In line with the Prime Minister's governing philosophy of "Rakyat Di Dahulukan", EPU will also listen to ideas and gather feedback from the rakyat on areas to be incorporated and issues to be addressed in the 11th Malaysia Plan. As such, we can expect this time around, there will be more public engagement in the process of preparing the 11th Malaysia Plan document. As can be seen from its website, EPU is now soliciting for ideas and feedback from the public on what are their suggestions for the 11th Malaysia Plan.

2. Community Involvement

The 11th Malaysia Plan (2016-2020) is going to be a very important government document. In the series of the five year plan, it is after all, the last document before Malaysia is to attain developed nation status.

In a nutshell, what this means is that the Dayak communities shouldn't miss this golden opportunity to provide feedbacks as well as suggestions; what are the policies issues benefiting the Dayak we would like the government to consider for implementation in the 11th Malaysia Plan.

Our community input is crucial bearing in mind that, as said in the preceding paragraph, the 11th Malaysia Plan is the final push to propel Malaysia to attain developed nation status. If we don't act now collectively, by way of giving input, we may miss the golden opportunity to ensure that the Dayak communities are on board.

The Sarawak Dayak Graduates Association (SDGA) feels it is a calling to act on this on behalf of the community. As such, we're planning to organise a one day workshop in Kuching on 22 March, 2015. This workshop is to be officiated by YB Tan Sri Datuk Amar Dr.James JemutMasing, Senior Minister and Minister of Land Development. The workshop would draw in participants from across the political divides working hand in hand with

Dayak intellectuals and members of the various Dayak NGOs. The target number of participant is from 100-150.

SDGA is well aware of the fact that the task is challenging, but is optimistic that, with the cooperation from all Dayak stakeholders, will be able to provide meaningful feedback to the government.

3. 11th Malaysia Plan (2016-2020) Thrust Areas

The Economic Planning Unit listed down eight (8) areas where public inputs are sought for. (<http://rmke11.epu.gov.my>, 12 /1/2015).The areas are:

a. Memperkuhpembangunaninklusif:

Strategibagimempertingkatkan taraf hidup si rumah berpendapatan 40 peratus terendah, memperkasada yasa ing Bumiputradalam aktiviti ekonomi, mempercepat transformasi bandar dan luar bandar serta memprkuhpembangunankomuniti.

b. Menujuke-arahpembangunan hijau:

Usaha untuk mengjudkan pembangunan sosioekonomi yang berdayasa ing dantekal persekitaran melui amalan kegunaan dan pengeluaran mampans eratapengurusan risiko bencana yang lebih cekap. Usaha ini akan memastikan pembangunan yang berteruskan menerusi penggunaan sumber yang mampan melalui pelaburan dalam asset semula jadi disamping meningkatkan kecekapan penggunaan serta jaminan sumber.

c. Meningkatkan kesejahteraan rakyat:

Strategi untuk menambah baik dan memperluas perkhidmatan penjagaan kesihatan, memastikan perumahan berkualiti dan mampu milik, memambah baik perkhidmatan kerajaan tempatan, mewujudkan persekitaran selamat, memprkuhpertumbuhan negara serta memperluas aktiviti sukan.

d. Memperkasa asas pertumbuhan:

Strategibagimempertingkatkan kecekapan dan liputan sistem pengangkutan serta takemudahani infrastruktur dan ICT, memastikan penyediaan perkhidmatan berdasarkan kemampuan pengguna dan menyediakan perkhidmatan, meningkatkan akses kepada bekalan air dan elektrik serta perkhidmatan pembentungan, mewujudkan sistem logistik bersepadu, serta menjana pertumbuhan mampan.

e. Memanfaatbakat:

Strategibagi menanganan jika tidak sepadan dengan penawaran dan permintaan pasar buruh, melahirkan tenaga kerja berkemahiran selaras dengan keperluan industry dan meningkatkan outcome pendidikan dalam usaha untuk membangunkan modal insan cemerlang yang

bermuladari padapendidikanawalkanak-kanak,
alampersekolahanhinggakealampekerjaandanpersaraan.

- f. Merekayasa pertumbuhan ekonomi:* Strategi untuk beralih kepada pertumbuhan berkualiti. Meningkatkan produktiviti dan daya saing, memberi tumpuan kepada inovasi, kreativiti dan daya saing, memberi tumpuan kepada inovasi, kreativiti dan sains dan teknologi, meningkatkan persekitaran ekonomi yang lebih dinamik dan memperkuuh dasar perniagaan.
- g. Merakyatkan perkhidmatan awam dan memperkuuh tarbiatus:* Strategi bagi menggaris arus penyampaian perkhidmatan, merasakan siasa struktur perkhidmatan awam, memastabat integrity, meningkatkan kapabiliti dan kapasi tipenjawatawam serta meningkatkan pengurusan program pembangunan.
- h. Malaysia melangkau 2020:* Menggariskan usaha pembangunan Malaysia selepas tahun 2020 dan mengandungi aspirasi terperinci untuk Negara berteraskan lima aspek berikut, iaitu ekonomi, social, teknologi, alam sekitar dan politik dan kerajaan.

4. Workshop Mission

The workshop to be held in Kuching on 22 March 2015 should address the above issues. A pertinent question that should be in the mind of every workshop participant is this; “***In each of the area listed above, what are our suggestions to the government that will promote, or at least take Dayak interests into consideration in the 11th Malaysia Plan period (2016-2020) and beyond?***”

5. Workshop Format

Participants will be divided into eight groups based on the above eight core areas. Each group is to be led by a moderator to be appointed among members of the group. Each of the group is required to present their discussion output for the plenary session.

The total sum output of all the group is to be presented to the government as Dayak input for the 11th Malaysia Plan (2016-2020) and beyond.

6. Conclusion

It is a rare opportunity indeed for the Dayak community to participate in the process of formulating government policy that ultimately will benefit the community at large. The

success of this workshop is highly dependable on the commitment of all workshop participants working in diverse group under tight time frame to contribute meaningfully. Together, let us contribute toward building a Dayak community that is dynamic, progressive and competitive.
